Nobel Bellosillo, M.D. age 54 died suddenly on July 30, 2020. Nobel was a devoted husband and son and an accomplished infectious disease physician. Nobel attended Middlesex Academy, Yale University, the University of Rochester Medical School and his Infectious disease fellowship at Tufts University. He practiced at Beth Israel Deaconess, Boston specializing in HIV treatment. Most recently Nobel turned his focus to bio research focusing on vaccine trials.

Nobel is survived by his husband of 25 years James Raymond of Asheville and father, Adlofo Bellosillo, MD in the Philippines.

Nobel had recently moved to Asheville from Florida and was building his dream home with his husband. Nobel was an accomplished pianist, had a passion for musical theater and dance, and his Jack Russel, Priscilla.

Nobel had a special gift to touch peoples lives and he made life just a little better for those he met. He will be deeply missed by all those who knew and loved him.


