



Alexis Zavoice

July 21, 1944 - April 24, 2015

Alexis B. Zavoice, 70, died on April 24, 2015 at Duke University Hospital as a result of complications following a successful lung transplant. At the time of his death, Alex was surrounded by his adoring family.

Alex was graduated from Norwich College and earned a Master's Degree in Mechanical Engineering from Stanford University. Alex then served 6 years in the U.S. Army and reached the rank of Captain.

Alex loved his work and was a loyal employee of Bechtel Corporation for 42 years. During his career, Alex managed many diverse engineering projects spanning refinery and petrochemical, space and defense, solar power, and commercial infrastructure. Alex was so passionate and energetic about his work that his colleagues nicknamed him "Zoom Zoom".

Alex loved life. Growing up in New England he was an avid skier, mountain climber, and collector of Rocks and Minerals. He then became enamored with hiking and backpacking, and later mountain biking. He would often bike to the top of Mount Diablo from his home in Walnut Creek, CA. He also enjoyed fly fishing with his favorite fishing companion, his son. He and his wife traveled extensively; hiking in the Pyrenees and in New Zealand, and exploring Spain, Italy, South America, and the US. After moving to Asheville NC, Alex invested himself in his new community by joining the hiking group, the photography

club, serving on the Architectural Review Committee, and thoroughly enjoying his retirement on Reynolds Mountain.

He is survived by his wife, Margie; daughter Tania; son Nicholas; grandchildren, Alexa and Maks; sisters Natasha, Tia, and Lissie; and brothers Stephen and Sabin. Alex loved his family and they will miss him dearly.

Alex was buried on Tuesday, April 28, 2015 in a private family ceremony. A Celebration of his Life will be held at a future date.
