



Mr. Arthur Calvin Knuth

October 13, 1936 - November 1, 2013

Arthur (Art) C. Knuth, 77, of Asheville, passed away Friday afternoon November 1st at Mission Hospital after an extended illness.

Born and raised in Peoria, Illinois, Art was a teacher and a counselor at various levels in the Midwest and here in Asheville, where he moved with his loving wife Leah, also an educator, in 1978 while working with the Kellwood Company.

Art was very active in his church, Biltmore United Methodist, serving on a number of committees over the years, including the church expansion projects. Art has also been a member of the Elks Club, starting the 1960's, participating in ritual teams, youth days and the lodge bowling team.

He is survived by his loving wife, Leah R. Williams Knuth; a sister, Mary Daxenbichler of Peoria, IL; one son, John Matthew Knuth of Southport, NC and one daughter, Susan Knuth Sherlin of Concord, VA; four grandchildren and two great-granddaughters.

A memorial service will be held at Biltmore United Methodist Church on Tuesday, November 5th, at 11:30 a.m. A time of visitation and fellowship will follow the service and light refreshments will be served.
