Bettina “Betty” Berkow Rosenthal, 87, died Thursday, September 4, 2014 at Transitions Life Care Hospice Center in Raleigh, NC. A native of Brooklyn, NY she was the daughter of the late Philip Berkow and Rose Gelsky.
