



## Mrs. Betty Bond Clowers

Betty Bond Clowers, 79, of Asheville died Sunday, February 20, 2011 at Arbor Terrace of Arden. A native of Coeburn, Virginia, she was daughter of the late Ray Hagan and Naomi Meadows Bond. In addition to her parents, she was also preceded in death by her husband of 51 years, Clarence Robert Clowers, son, Richard Christian Clowers and brother, William Edward Bond.
