Her house, her friends, and her dogs brought her great joy each day.

Carmen was preceded in death by her parents, Ret. Gen. Theme T. Everton and Carmen Everton, and her brother, Phillip Everton. Carmen is survived by her sister, Christie; her two sons, Michael and Brian and four grandchildren, Alex, Bridget, Colin, and Conor.
