David Duncan Cameron passed away May 3, 2020 at the age of 76 after a lengthy illness. He was born on June 22, 1943, in Huntington, NY, son of the late Arch and Margaret (Tipton) Cameron; his family moved to Asheville, NC when he was a child.
