An angel was taken from his sister, Mary Kay; brothers Ben III (Joseph) and Dennis (Dawn); nieces, Tammy, Robin and Kimberly; nephews, Clark Benjamin (Kristina) and Matthew David; and from many devoted, beloved friends—as David Henry Streets ended a seventeen-year battle with prostate cancer on December 28, 2024.

The second son of Louise Rowe Streets and Dr. Ben F. Streets, Jr., David was a dedicated historian and phenomenal genealogist (author, teacher and lecturer). He was born May 3, 1948 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; grew up in Pinellas Park and Seminole, Florida; and has lived in Black Mountain, North Carolina for the past forty-six years.

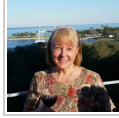
