Edward T. Ehresman, 92, good and faithful servant went to his heavenly home on June 5, 2013. He was married to Mabel Mullikin Ehresman for 69 years before her death in 2012.

Ed was born in Leola, SD and graduated from Westmar College in LeMars, Iowa. He received his Masters of Divinity from Evangelical Theological Seminary in Naperville, IL. From there, he went on to serve Evangelical United Brethren/United Methodist Churches in North and South Dakota, Kentucky and North Carolina for 51 years including years spent at Red Bird Mission as minister, Assistant Superintendent and Executive Director. He was a servant/leader in the congregations and communities where he lived, often helping with farm work, economic development, educational opportunities, health care facilities, and was certainly involved in the middle of any activity in those churches. Until his "retirement" in 1984, he served 2 - 4 congregations in each area simultaneously. Once he retired, he only served one church at a time.

He will be missed by many and fondly remembered for the love and examples he set.

Surviving are his six children, Mary Alwine and her husband, Terry, Patricia Swanson, Carol Ruminski and her husband, Joe, Ruth Harris, David

Ehresman and his wife, Sharon and Hope Adams and her husband, Terry. Also surviving are eleven grandchildren and ten great-grandchildren.
