



## Ms. Eunice Hope Sluyter

December 13, 1916 - August 27, 2014

Eunice Sluyter, 97, of Asheville, went to be with her Lord August 27, 2014 at Brooks-Howell Home. She was born December 13, 1916, in New York, to Rev. Dr. Henry Sluyter and Bertha L. Erskine.

She graduated from Hope College in Holland, Michigan in 1938 then became a volunteer teacher in Crossnore, NC. Her next assignment with the Reformed Church Missionary Board was in India. During her first five years as a missionary she met Sarah Chakko, principal of Isabella Thoburn College, the first women's college in Asia. Sarah invited Eunice to teach at Isabella Thoburn College, which she did for five years. Eunice became a United Methodist Women's Division Missionary, and earned her MA from New York University. She then worked in the Treasurer's office of the Women's Division. After completing the Publishing course at New York University, she became publisher of the Lucknow Publishing House for the Methodist Church in India. Upon her return to the United States she worked with the Area Agency on Aging in Florida, and then went to Nova University in Fort Lauderdale as adjunct professor in the Learning Technology department.

She retired to Brooks-Howell Home in 1998, and was a member of Central United Methodist Church.

Survivors include a niece, Brenda J. Sluyter, of Carmel, CA. and her dear friend, Ethel M. Raddon of Asheville.

A Celebration of Life for Eunice Sluyter will be held at Brooks-Howell Home Memorial Chapel on Sep. 10 at 3:30p.m. Rev Don Turman and Rev Dr

Richard Smyth will officiate.

Memorials in her honor can be given to Brooks-Howell Home.
