



Mr. George Theodore Miller

October 29, 1921 - October 13, 2011

George Theodore Miller, 89, of Asheville, North Carolina, was called home to be with his Savior and Lord on October 13, 2011.

A 1943 graduate of The Cooper Union Institute of Technology with a degree in chemical engineering, his career spanned 50 years as a scientist at OXYCHEM in Grand Island, New York. During his career he generated numerous patents in chemical engineering, and was recognized as “Inventor of the Year” by OXYCHEM and the Niagara Frontier Patent Law Association. He worked under contract with the Atomic Energy Commission, was widely published in the fields of electrochemistry and chemical engineering, and traveled, consulted, and lectured world-wide.

He was active in his church as a founding member of the Lewiston Assembly of God in New York, and was an active member of the Niagara Falls Camp of the Gideons International. Following retirement, he was also active with the Gideons organization in Hendersonville, North Carolina, and with the First Baptist Church in Hendersonville.

He is survived by his wife, Winifred Miller; four children: Roger Miller of Daytona Beach, Florida; Jane Bristol of Niagara Falls, New York; Susan Heath of Los Gatos, California; and Nancy Scogna of Charlottesville, Virginia; and nine grandchildren.

A memorial service in celebration and thanksgiving for the life of George Miller will be held on Friday, October 21 at 2:00 p.m. in St. Giles Chapel, the Deerfield Retirement Community, Asheville, North Carolina.
