



Mrs. Marian Bragg Minnich

February 14, 1917 - April 8, 2011

Marian Bragg Minnich, 94, long-term resident of Highland Farms in Black Mountain, passed away April 8, 2011. She was the daughter of Naval Capt. Kendal B. Bragg and Kathleen B. Bragg, and was the wife of the late S. Clinton Minnich, Jr. who died in 2004. She was also preceded in death by her beloved brother Dr. John K. Bragg of Asheville and her sister-in-law Mary Bragg.

She grew up around the world in a Navy family. She had been a resident of Asheville since 1947 and was very active in local church and community affairs. Before moving to Black Mountain she was a member of the First Presbyterian Church and served as a Deacon and choir member. She was also Treasurer of the Women of the Church for many years. She was Treasurer of the Friends of the Library for 23 years. She was a member of the Asheville Junior League and the Children's Welfare League. She was one of the founders of ABCCM. In 1988 Marian and Clint moved to Highland Farms in Black Mountain and became members of the Black Mountain Presbyterian Church.

Marian loved music, photography and collecting keepsakes from around the world. She also loved spending afternoons with the Canada geese and ducks in Black Mountain and became a keen observer of their habits and seasonal patterns. In her spare time she continued her lifelong delight in reading.

Survivors include her sons Larry Minnich and Dr. Ken Minnich, both of Asheville.

A graveside service will be held Wednesday April 13th at 3 PM at Riverside Cemetery with the Rev. Shannon Kershner of Black Mountain Presbyterian Church presiding.
