Marjorie Anne Rowe Mann of Asheville, NC, passed away on Friday, November 6th, 2020. Born in Detroit, Michigan, on October 1st, 1960, Margie spent her formative years in Bay City, Michigan.

Following her graduation from T.L. Handy High School in 1978, Margie completed her undergraduate degree at Alma College and obtained her law degree from Wake Forest University. Margie practiced law in Charlotte and subsequently in Asheville until the time of her death. 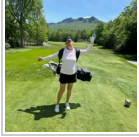
