



Miss Mary Toole Parker

June 17, 1914 - February 24, 2012

Mary Toole Parker, 97, died February 24 at the house on Charlotte Street that had been her family's home since 1867. She was born in Asheville on June 17, 1914. Miss Parker, who was a noted citizen of Asheville and was designated one of the city's Living Treasures in 2011, participated in the founding and growth of many Asheville organizations and was known for her encyclopedic knowledge of its history. She was the last of seven Parker brothers and sisters in her generation, many of them also distinguished professionals and volunteers. For most of her adult life, she worked as sales promotion director at the downtown Bon Marché Department Store. During WWII, Miss Parker volunteered for relief projects to aid Europe. In 1947, she was a founding member of the Asheville chapter of the League of Women Voters, remaining active with them for forty years. In the 1950s, she became a member of the Friends of the Library, serving twice as their president and winning the 1990 NC Public Library Directors' Association Library Friend of the Year Award. She also served on the board of the YWCA, working with their Phyllis Wheatley Branch to foster friendships among women of different racial backgrounds. She was also involved with the Colburn Mineral Museum, Common Cause, Memorial Mission Hospital Auxiliary, and Pisgah Legal Services, to name only a few. Miss Parker was a lifelong member of Trinity Episcopal Church. She touched many lives and generations and will be sorely missed by her family and friends.

A memorial service will be held at 11:00 AM, Saturday, March 3, 2012 at Trinity Episcopal Church with Rev. Carol Hubbard officiating.
