



## Norma Tanner Snap

October 21, 1927 - May 1, 2021

Norma Virginia Tanner Snap, age 93 of Asheville, died peacefully Saturday evening, May 1, 2021, with her husband, Alfred H. Snap and her son, Stephen J. Snap by her side.

Born in Urbana, Illinois in 1927, she was the daughter of Clayton Tanner and Clara Tanner. Norma grew up in Urbana and graduated from Urbana High School in 1945. She received a Bachelor of Arts degree in the teaching of English in 1949 from the University of Illinois. She taught high school English for one year, third grade for a few years and was an elementary school librarian for a few years.

She married Alfred Snap in 1950 in the First Baptist Church of Urbana, Illinois. Through family and friends they maintained a long time association with the church. They retired and moved to Asheville in 1980. Norma was active in community affairs and served as past President of the Asheville New Friends Club, life member of the Association of University Women, and former board member of the Women's Society of Central United Methodist Church. She was a member of P.E.O. Chapter AD, Biltmore Village Historic Museum, Friends of the Library, Judge for Beverdam Precinct #21, and former member of the Asheville Art Museum Auxillary and the Asheville Art Museum.

Surviving in addition to her husband is her son, Stephen Snap. Also surviving are numerous nieces and nephews. Two brothers preceded her in death.
