Patricia Lynn Alexander Masters (Pat), born September 20, 1939, in Asheville to Benjamin Fredrick Alexander and Lucille Jones, entered the presence of her Heavenly Father on October 25, 2015. Pat was educated in Asheville schools and Montreat College. In her late teens she met Stanley Allen Masters II, a student at Clemson University. They were married at the Central Methodist Church; lived in Biloxi, Mississippi and Omaha, Nebraska, then settled in Asheville for the rest of her life on property near Allen's parents, Stanley and Martha Masters of Beaverdam.

Pat taught kindergarten at Little Beaver and worked with patients registering new births at Memorial Mission Hospital. She and Allen also created jewelry with her brother and sister-in-law at Nelon Designs.
