She presented one of her paintings to be hung over the mantle of the governor's summer mansion in Asheville. A writer of poetry, her works were read on national T.V. by Arthur Smith and recognized by First Lady Lady Bird Johnson. She attended Asbury Memorial U.M.C. in Asheville and was a member of Winter Park Baptist Church in Wilmington,

where she was a volunteer for 20 years with Cape Fear Hospital and a member of Cape Fear Eastern Star Chapter 364. She served in all offices and was made a life member. She also enjoyed square dancing.
